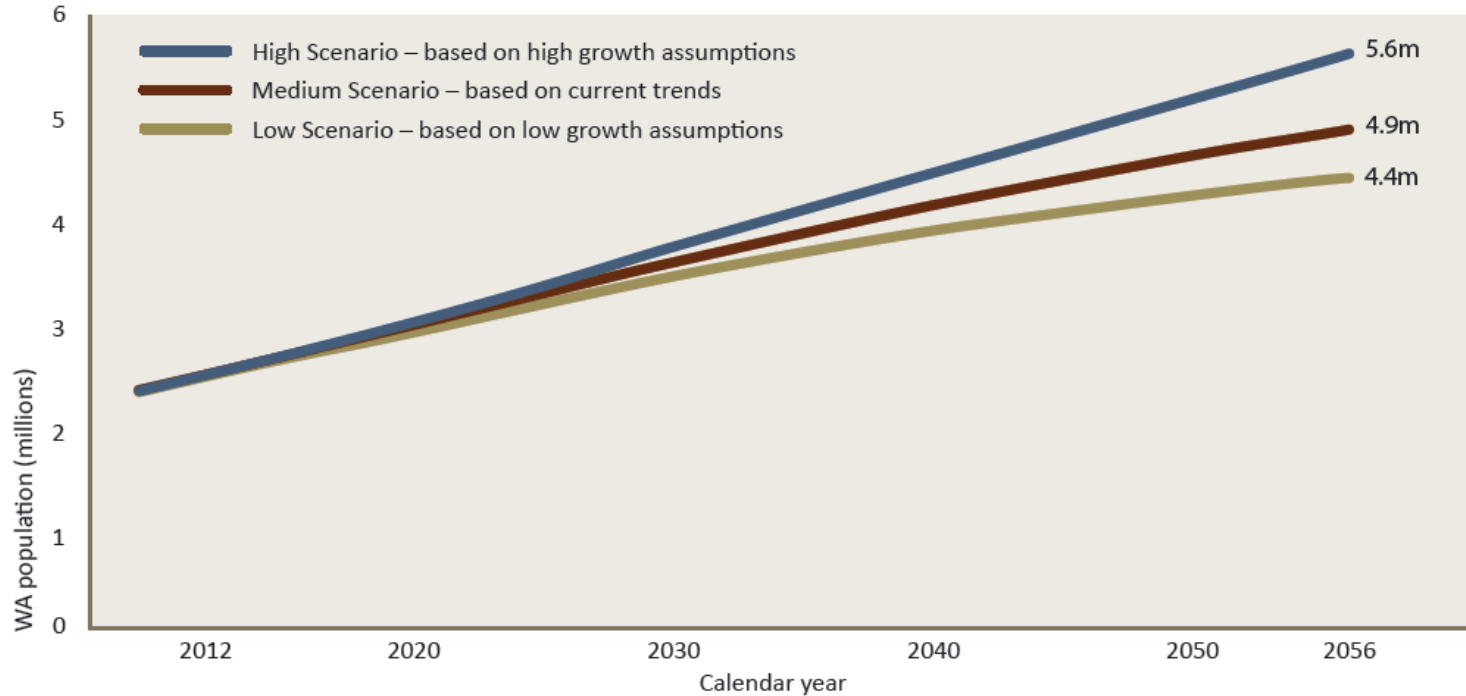

TARGET

Residential infill development reaches **47 per cent**



HOUSING SUPPLY

Ensure as many **new homes** and jobs as possible are within existing **activity centres**, linked with efficient **public transport** routes



HOUSING DIVERSITY/ AFFORDABILITY

Increase housing diversity and affordability as **800,000** new homes will be needed to accommodate our **increased population**



WATER

Achieve efficient use of water sources in a **drying climate**. Perth's groundwater supply is already **under pressure**



ENVIRONMENT

Ensure the regions' **environmental assets** are protected – the regions sit within **Australia's only global biodiversity hotspot**



REDUCE CAR DEPENDENCY

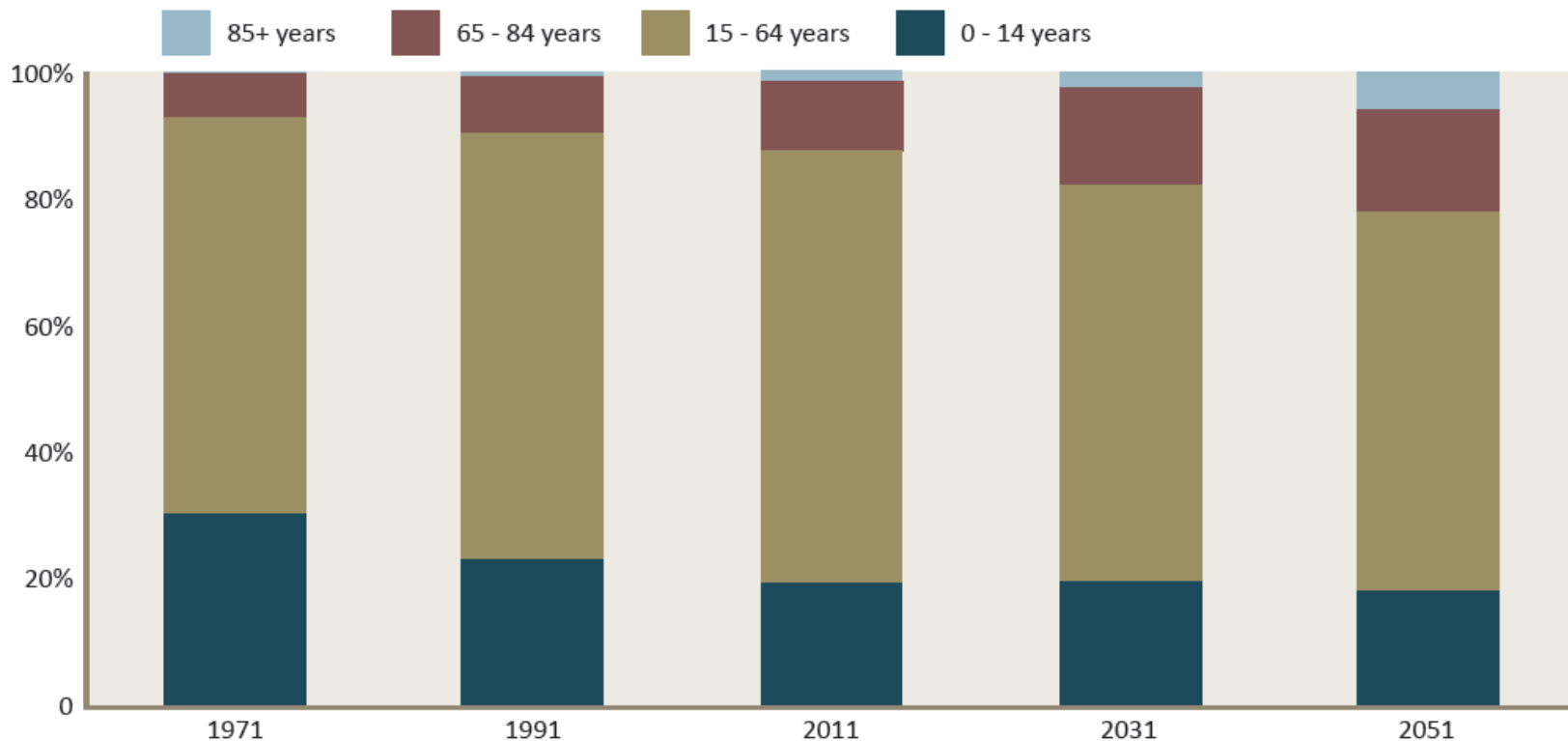
Perth has one of the highest car use rates in the world with more than **three quarters** of us **travelling to work by car**

Age distribution WA population (WAPC)



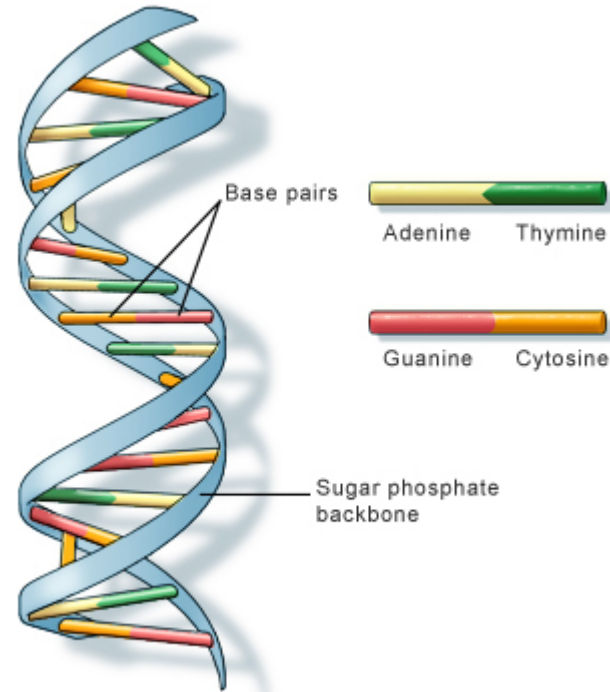
